Washington and King David's Lodge

IN THIS MONTH of George Washington's birthday, Freemasons across the United States remember this great man and the fact that he also traveled toward the East.

Among the many Masonic connections to Washington, is this exchange of letters between the first President and King David's Lodge of Newport, R.I., founded in 1769 as the first Jewish Lodge of Masons in America. A public address to Washington, issued by the lodge on August 18, 1790, reads in part:

"We, the Master, Wardens, and Brethren of King David Lodge, greet you as a Brother. We exult in the thought that as Masonry has always been patronized by the wise, the good, and the great; so has it stood and will always stand as its fixtures are on the immutable pillars of faith, hope, and charity . . . permit us then, Illustrious Brother, to salute you three times three and to add our fervent supplications that the Sovereign Architect of the Universe will always encompass you with His holy protection."

To which the President responded: "Being persuaded that a just application of the principles on which the Masonic fraternity is founded must be promotive of private virtue and public prosperity, I shall always be happy to advance the interests of the Society, and to be considered by them a deserving Brother."
